20 years later, the annual **Breast Cancer Education Conference** continues to inspire and educate. Renowned



experts share the latest advancements in research, treatment and care in a supportive and inspiring environment. The day includes opportunities to connect with others and discover practical tools and resources for dealing with the challenges of surviving and living with breast cancer. The only event of its kind in the Twin Cities, this conference is relevant to anyone whose life may be affected by breast cancer - newly diagnosed, in treatment, survivors, caregivers, family members and health care professionals.

Conference Sessions

Are We Winning the War on Cancer? The "National Cancer Act" was signed 50 years ago, signaling the start of the war on cancer. Dr. Doug Yee shares the progress we have made in breast cancer treatment, based on the translation of laboratory science to the clinic, and the role of clinical trials in advancing cancer care.

**Breast Cancer Vaccines: Are They for Real?** Dr. Keith Knutson provides an overview of developments in breast cancer vaccines, in his lab and others, with a focus on the types of vaccines being developed, recent remarkable clinical trial results, and the promise of vaccination as a means for preventing breast cancer.

**Emerging Telehealth and Virtual Cancer Care Solutions** The COVID-19 pandemic transformed health care and patient-provider communications with broad adoption of telehealth technologies. Dr. Tufia Haddad discusses these new care delivery models, and the ways cancer care teams are using them to deliver care at a distance.

**Somethings Old, Somethings New, Somethings Borrowed** Dr. Mark Migliori shares an update on the continually changing concepts and techniques of breast reconstruction, with a particular emphasis on implant-based reconstruction and implant safety.

#### TUFIA C. HADDAD, MD

Dr. Haddad is Chair of the Breast Medical Oncology practice at Mayo Clinic in Rochester. Her research focuses on experimental therapeutics and early-phase clinical trials for drug-resistant breast cancer, as well as the transformation of breast cancer survivor care with technology-enabled solutions. Dr. Haddad has been recognized as a "Top Doctor" by Minnesota Monthly Magazine (2015-2017).



### KEITH L. KNUTSON, PHD

Dr. Knutson is a Professor of Immunology at Mayo Clinic College of Medicine and Science and director of the Mayo Clinic Cancer Center's Cancer Immunology and Immunotherapy Program. Keith currently has three FDA-approved vaccine trials underway and is a Principal Investigator of 3 grants to test vaccines aimed at preventing the recurrence of breast cancer, including triple negative breast cancer.




### MARK R. MIGLIORI, MD, FACS
